Dear Friends,

Personally, I have never been summoned to a court of law to be a witness, but I suspect that some of you who are reading this will have been. Witnesses are vital to our legal system which is underpinned by our democracy. Witnesses have to have many qualities but I would suggest that the three most important are courage, trustworthiness and credibility.

The early Christian communities were founded after the resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ, and although no one actually witnessed the resurrection, the apostles did witness the risen Christ. I do sometimes wonder what kind of witness I would have been had I been there. I'm not sure that I would have been any use at all, I even wonder if I would have been the one who was questioning how Jesus got into the room as hadn't used the door.

Fortunately, for me and the rest of us, the apostles made much better witnesses than I would ever have done. Imagine how much courage they must have had! They were all prepared to suffer (and most of them did gladly suffer death for no greater crime than evangelising the Christian message). They were trustworthy, they were completely certain that they had met Jesus and this must have come across in their ministries as they lived their lives of service to others and in doing so made their witness believable. But perhaps most of all was their credibility. I don't believe the apostles to be gullible, some and particularly Thomas were slow to believe that Jesus had risen from the dead. There are plenty who live amongst us that would suggest that the resurrection was invented by the apostles to justify their faith, but I would argue that the opposite is true and that the faith of the apostles was nurtured and grown from their witness of the risen Jesus. And in living their faith, they were the bridge between the risen Jesus and the life of the Church.

Here in 21st century Feltham, it is incumbent upon us to be the witnesses. The way we witness is how we live our lives, as those who bear witness by their behaviour are the most valuable witness of all. Sometimes we all get a bit disillusioned by our personal failures or our personal weaknesses but perhaps we could take inspiration from St Teresa of Calcutta who once said "I don't pray for success, I only pray that I may be a faithful witness."
