MATTHEW 5:17-37

Jesus tells his disciples that he is not abolishing the law, but fulfilling what Moses and the prophets taught. However, he makes clear that professional law-keepers have insufficient righteousness to enter the kingdom of heaven.

Jesus further connects his teachings with the teachings of Moses and the Old Testament, here is described as the Law and the Prophets. In Jesus' time, only the Old Testament had been written. The first five books were considered to be written by Moses and much of the rest was written by prophets. We are in the Sermon on the Mount, according to St. Matthew. The lectionary gives us a series of extracts from that to be read over these Sundays before the beginning of Lent. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus offers a description of those who belong to his Kingdom: their behaviour, their prayer. He shows us how to live worthy as sons of God our Father: in other words, how concretely to live his own attitudes to God, and to one another.

If we find ourselves confused when we look to God's law for direction, we must consider Jesus as the living law of God.

If we find ourselves confused when we search to God's law for answers, we must consider Jesus as the exemplar of all creation.

If we find ourselves in pain when we look to God's law for solace, we must consider Jesus as God's answer to the corruption the world gives us.

If we find ourselves anxious about God's law and its consequences, we must consider the integrity and authenticity of Jesus.

If we find ourselves at peace in giving ourselves over completely to God's law. We realize that we have brought Jesus' message into our hearts and we begin to put God's message together.

The picture Jesus paints is beautiful, inspiring, appealing, and noble. If everyone could live like that, just think, how happy the world would be. There would be an end to all wars, all poverty, family dysfunctions, all injustice!

AN EXCERPT FROM THE MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS ON THE XXXI WORLD DAY OF THE SICK

The Samaritan calls the innkeeper to "take care of him" (Lk 10:35). Jesus addresses the same call to each of us. He exhorts us to "go and do likewise" (Lk 10:37). As I noted in Fratelli Tutti, "The parable shows us how a community can be rebuilt by men and women who identify with the vulnerability of others, who reject the creation of a society of exclusion, and act instead as neighbours, lifting up and rehabilitating the fallen for the sake of the common good" (No. 67). Indeed, "we were created for a fulfilment that can only be found in love. We cannot be indifferent to suffering" (No. 68).

On 11 February 2023, let us turn our thoughts to the Shrine of Lourdes, a prophetic lesson entrusted to the Church for our modern times. It is not only what functions well or those who are productive that matter. Sick people, in fact, are at the centre of God's people, and the Church advances together with them as a sign of a humanity in which everyone is precious and no one should be discarded or left behind.

To the intercession of Mary, Health of the Sick, I entrust all of you who are ill; you who care for them in your families, or through your work, research and volunteer service; and those of you who are committed to weaving personal, ecclesial, and civic bonds of fraternity.
