## Be perfect, be free

Who cannot be moved by court room scenes where a father forgives the killer of his son and wants to take care of him and help him turn out into a decent human being?

There is such a short clip on YouTube, the father embraces the criminal. He has gone beyond the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees

In the long Sermon on the Mount our Lord invites us to contemplate what it is to be perfect. "Be holy for I the Lord your God am holy." (Lev 19.2) "Be perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect." (Matt 5.48)

The Sermon on the Mount builds on and completes the Old Law given to Moses. Beginning with the Beatitudes Our Lord is completing, perfecting the law.

But why be perfect? What's in it for you and me? Happiness. To be perfect is to be happy. It is to be truly yourself. As long as we are caught up in rivalry and retaliation, resentment and harbouring ill we are not happy. We are tangled up inside. We are not free. Our humanity is mangled, distorted.

The desire of the Lord is for us to be free. Being perfect then, being holy is about freedom and a freedom to love perfectly which makes us capable of participating in the kingdom of God, in God's gratuitous grace. That's the goal of our lives.

So we have to practise this freedom. We can become holy. We have to practise overcoming instincts which are contrary to the way of God's love. Repentance says: I wish I'd never been like that. I want to live in a new way.

In the examples of today's gospel, Our Lord proposes overcoming evil with radical generosity. Do the unexpected. Presenting the right cheek to be slapped would be presenting yourself for the worst kind of insult in New Testament times. Your enemy would be taken aback. A tunic was an undergarment. So if you offered your cloak as well the person would be taken aback. If you were forced to go a mile (like St Simon of Cyrene was forced) offer to go further.

So are we called to be doormats? Certainly not. Excessive goodness is often a rebuke, repudiating the evil. "Look what you are doing!", "do you really intend to be like this?"

This does not exclude legitimate self-defence and defence of the powerless, of one's family and goods.

What Our Lord is teaching us is that the New Law of his love goes way beyond what society might call common sense justice. As St Paul tells us: "...the wisdom of this world is foolishness to God."

As we approach Lent perhaps there is food for thought for all of us. Might the Lord be calling me to a deeper holiness, a freer and more generous life, a righteousness which is about love.

May God bless us all this holy season as he renews our faith in Jesus.
