Dear Friends

There is an old saying "Familiarity breeds contempt" which I guess to a greater or lesser extent we are all guilty of. It could be contempt towards our employer, a club or society to which we are members or even towards members of our own families.

In today's first reading Amoziah quite literally tells Amos to "Go back to his own country and to earn his living there." Well that certainly tells us that racism is nothing new and that even in biblical times there were people who could not see foreigners as anything more than a threat. It is ironic that in a week when the England football team has done so well, that the fact that eight of the starting eleven in the first team are descended from immigrants, somehow seems to be overlooked by the media. The same reasoning can be applied to health care workers and many other trades and professions.

It is far too easy for us to be blind to the nature of things or people and, as a result, not take full advantage of those blessings that others bring to us.

Exactly the same applies to our membership of Christ's Catholic Church. We are of course still living with the pandemic and I realise that it is not always possible to admit everyone to church. But even if we are unable to admit you to the building you will always be members of God's family with Jesus our Lord as both its living head and its treasure. All too often we take our membership of it for granted and as a result not make full use of the blessings which we enjoy from God. And it is in today's second reading that St Paul tells us that in Christ every heavenly blessing is to be found in His Body, The Church. Were it not for the loving providence of God any one of us could have been born outside of our church or possibly not even born at all. Surely this should inspire us to appreciate what the church really is and to go out, as the apostles went out, to do God's work in our communities and in our workplaces.

## Motivation for Mark 6:7-13

"This reading provides a stark reminder about the attitude that we as followers of Christ should adopt if we are to be true disciples. He asks us, like the first disciples to lay down any fears we may have, and to wholeheartedly trust in His providence and His goodness. It requires us to delicately trust in His generosity whilst also courageously stand in defiance of our own fallacious plans for happiness and fulfilment.

We can ask ourselves what we are attached to in this world? Whether it be material things, reputations, vain hopes or disabling fears. What could you let go of that would make you freer to follow Christ? We should desire freedom from our worldly attachments; however, it can be so difficult to loosen our tight grip. I encourage you humbly bring them to the Lord today!"
