Dear Friends,

I'm never quite sure what to say about The Sadducee's who try to trick Jesus in today's gospel. The claim to believe in God but at the same time also believe that your soul dies with you and that there is no afterlife. Perhaps that is why they were sad, you see?

It is truthful to say that the Israelites were poor and oppressed people in Egypt and yet God chose them as his people. A further truth is that they became a symbol of freedom from slavery, freedom from death and mortality and rebirth through water. During their desert journey the Israelites were sustained by manna (Bread) from heaven. A representation of this ritual is still practiced annually at the Passover (Seder) meal where we are reminded that even though we were not present at that time with Moses, Miriam et al, we still undergo that liberating reminder of that truth. Or to put it another way, living remembrance of a past event that has become real when we enter into it. That is to say it has become real in our time.

However, despite the many challenges they faced, God, who had chosen Moses as the leader of the Israelites, was to be the person to whom he would reveal the Ten Commandments or the Ten Truths. They include regulations or laws relating to God, to keep the sabbath holy and to honour your parents, as well as rules or laws on idolatry, blasphemy, murder, adultery, theft, dishonesty and coveting. The Israelites had drifted away from covenant law and had endured famine and plague and at one point they even worshiped a golden calf, cast from all the jewellery that that they had with them. Through the Ten Commandments Moses led the Israelites to recommit themselves to a covenant with God.

Last Tuesday we celebrated All Saints (I doubt there is anything for the Sadducees in that solemnity). The gospel for All Saints day is the beatitudes from Matthew where Jesus "updates" the Ten Commandments. For example, in ancient times "an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth", Jesus was of course referring to the Torah but was he really saying that if someone causes you actual bodily harm then to redress the balance you should cause them actual bodily harm. (I don't think so), but I do think what Jesus is actually implementing is a statute of limitation. He does this by saying is that you shouldn't extract more than has been taken from you, in fact he is even saying that you shouldn't even do that, he is saying that in times of insult or injury you should turn the other cheek. Even this might seem odd to us in the modern era, for it is saying that if you suffer humiliation from an enemy or foe then rise above it.

From a social perspective this is quite challenging because surely it is human nature to fight back either by word or by deed when you are attacked but Jesus updates the Old Testament teaching when he tells us to love our enemies as we love our neighbours and to pray for those who persecute us. Once again I find myself saying it is particularly difficult to be a Christian and it is particularly difficult to be a Catholic Christian. But perhaps this week I can also say it would be far easier to be a Sadducee.
