Dear Friends

Happy New Year! This weekend we begin the Season of Advent and with that, a new liturgical year. In previous years, Advent has been rather obscured in the headlong rush to Christmas, with office parties, Christmas shopping and such busyness that by the time we arrive at 24<sup>th</sup> December, we are often unable to focus on the joyful reality of the Incarnation and with it the greatest love story the world has known. However, this is to anticipate... we must as the old saying goes "fast before we feast".

It may seem that we have been in a state of expectant waiting – which is a good description of Advent and indeed these past months of living under the restrictions caused by the pandemic have been at times penitential... The imminent arrival of the vaccines is a very hopeful sign and we can take encouragement from that. However, and this is hard, we cannot let up our guard just yet!! With the easing of lockdown restrictions later this week, there will be a natural desire to go out, see people and re-engage. We can do this, but in a controlled and measured way, that looks to each other's safety. When we think of it as a deeply charitable act then, I think, this will help us to do so in a spirit of love and charity. More than this, we can really begin to engage with Advent. There is a quieter spirit this year, a chance to let the readings and liturgy speak to us of the longing for the Messiah, of whom the prophets spoke.

The Advent liturgy is more solemn than usual. The purple vestments and the Advent hymns and themes of preparing for Our Lord's Coming betoken an opportunity to get things ready, to have a spiritual "tidy up". In order to engage with the season, we might like to consider taking up some new spiritual reading, or spiritual practice, such as an extra decade of the Rosary, either daily or weekly. Importantly, I suggest, it should be something realistic or manageable and one that draws us up from the everyday into something more.

Traditionally Advent is split into two parts: the first part focuses on the Second Coming of Our Lord when everything will be completed. It's an opportunity to ground ourselves in the present moment and to make the most of the opportunities offered each day. It's a time of "already but not yet" – we are heralds of our faith by our way of living. The Advent hymn gives us a clue to this:

*"On Jordan's Bank, the Baptist's cry, announces that the Lord is nigh. Come then and hearken, for He brings, glad tidings from the King of Kings".*

May we all have a blessed and peaceful Advent as we wait "in joyful hope" for Our Saviour's Coming!

Let's pray for each other!

Night is God's favourite time, because when we are at our weakest he shows his might. Stay awake to see him acting!

#### Act

God of all times who come to visit us when we least expect you, open our eyes to your arrival so that we may experience the liberating power of your presence.

### Bidding Prayers for the week:

#### We turn to God our Father and put our needs before him:

We pray for the Church, that she may bear witness to God's presence in Advent so that we may be ready to greet Jesus at Christmas.

For our families and communities: that we may find space in our lives to watch and pray for Christ's coming.

For all those suffering through poverty and injustice: may the Lord give them healing and courage.

For people who are sick and feel they are a burden, for all who are in hospital and residential care, for those suffering with Covid-19, and for all those who love and care for them.

For all the faithful departed: that they may find rest for their souls and be led rejoicing through the gates of paradise.

### The Church will re-open on Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> December for Mass with 2metre social distancing.:

Face coverings are mandatory in Church and all those attending must wear a face covering which should be kept on during the whole service - mouth and nose covered.

- If someone comes to church and is then tested positive for the virus, the church must be closed for 72 hours
- Confessions on Saturdays at 10.30am with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and at 5.30pm.

### UPDATE ON COVID RESTRICTIONS FROM BISHOP JOHN SHERRINGTON:

**Funerals:** Funerals can be attended by a maximum of 30 people, and it is advised that only close friends and family attend. Linked ceremonial events such as stone settings and ash scatterings can also continue with up to 15 people in attendance. Anyone working i.e. the priest, cantor, organist, pallbearers, stewards, etc. is not included in the 30.

**Weddings:** From 2<sup>nd</sup> December weddings can take place in Church with a maximum of 15 people in attendance including the bride and groom.

**NHS COVID-19 Test and Trace App:** On 24<sup>th</sup> September the NHS launched its Covid-19 Test and Trace App. This app has been developed to assist the Government with its test and trace policy and uses a smartphone. The app works by using the 'Bluetooth' system, which all smartphones have. It registers any other phones within a certain distance, which also has the app installed. This takes place between the phones themselves and its entirely anonymous. Please try and use this if you can.
