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

Dear Friends

Be careful what you wish for, you might get it!! This is of course a well known bit of advice and I understand that many cultures and languages around the world have a version of it.

In today's Gospel, James and John are almost falling over each other to ask a favour of Jesus. As is so often the case James and John had a human vision of Jesus where political power would be inferred upon them when Jesus became "King" They had no idea that Jesus' kingdom would not be an earthly kingdom but a spiritual kingdom in heaven.

Without a doubt James and John were ambitious and when Jesus asked them to drink his cup and share in his baptism they eagerly said yes, not realising that in doing so they were committing to serve and that the earthly power that they had in mind would never be theirs.

James and John didn't have the faith to see that their journey of life, with the personal suffering that this would undoubtedly bring them, would be true discipleship. To be a follower of Jesus is to love and to serve. I cannot pretend that this is an easy path to follow. Often life can be difficult and challenging, I am certain that all of you reading this will have suffered bereavement and that many of you will have suffered redundancy or unemployment, or not done as well at school as you might have hoped.

It is too easy to replace love with power, to exercise power is much easier than to exercise love, but Jesus didn't come down from heaven to wield power over us, he came from heaven to love us. And in loving us he served us. Jesus teaches us to build a community that liberates people from competition and power.

We are all challenged to lead a Christian life. However, that Christian life also means Christian leadership. Loving service should be the main characteristic of our Christian leadership. Love is made visible in service and in service we grow in love, and in love we grow in faith.

I finish by quoting paragraph 26 from LUMEN FIDEI, the first Papal Encyclical written by Pope Francis in 2013

This being the case, can Christian faith provide a service to the common good with regard to the right way of understanding truth? To answer this question, we need to reflect on the kind of knowledge involved in faith. Here a saying of Saint Paul can help us: "One believes with the heart" (Rom 10:10). In the Bible, the heart is the core of the human person, where all his or her different dimensions intersect: body and spirit, interiority and openness to the world and to others, intellect, will and affectivity. If the heart is capable of holding all these dimensions together, it is because it is where we become open to truth and love, where we let them touch us and deeply transform us. Faith transforms the whole person precisely to the extent that he or she becomes open to love. Through this blending of faith and love we come to see the kind of knowledge which faith entails, its power to convince and its ability to illumine our steps. Faith knows because it is tied to love, because love itself brings enlightenment. Faith's understanding is born when we receive the immense love of God which transforms us inwardly and enables us to see reality with new eyes.
